We have some current concerns about the carpool drop-off and pick-up on the playground and some issues that are related.

## **Carpool Information**

- **Do not stop in the passing lane.** Use the passing lane to pass only. Please do not have your children load or unload from the passing lane or any other undesignated area.
- **Please keep in the driving lanes.** Do not cut across the center area.
- **Children need to load and unload in the pick-up lane by the building.** Please do not let them cut through traffic – this is for their own safety.
- **Do not park or leave your vehicle anywhere on the playground area.** Park in the southwest parking lot if you need to go in the building.
- **There is no pick-up or drop-off before or after school in front of the building.**

## ***Every Moment Counts!***

We love your children and want their day to get off to a good start. ***Every Moment Counts!*** Please plan on having your children arrive at school at 8:15 or shortly after so they have time to go to their classrooms, say hi to their friends, put their things away, and be in their seats ready to learn by 8:25 a.m. Miss Davis begins school announcements at 8:25. Classroom instruction begins at 8:30 a.m.

If students arrive before 8:15 they will be asked to stay in the main hall by the cafeteria, so we can provide supervision. Teachers are preparing for their students and their classrooms are not open before 8:15. At 8:15 students can go to their classrooms.

## **Late Arrival**

If your child arrives after the 8:30 bell, he/she needs to check in at the office. They will be given a check-in slip to give to their teacher.

## **Breakfast**

Breakfast is served in the cafeteria beginning at 8:00 a.m. Students should be finished eating by 8:20.
